## TRANSFER ARTICULATION AGREEMENT BETWEEN BERMUDA COLLEGE'S ASSOCIATE DEGREE IN ARTS & SCIENCE (AD-ARTS) AND AMERICAN INTERNATIONAL COLLEGE

#### Objectives of this Agreement:

- To attract qualified students to BERMUDA COLLEGE and AMERICAN INTERNATIONAL COLLEGE.
- 2. To promote an efficient transition of transfer students who have received an approved Associate Degree from BERMUDA COLLEGE with a minimum cumulative grade point average of 2.00 on a 4.00 scale into junior status at AMERICAN INTERNATIONAL COLLEGE.
- 3. To provide information and guidelines for students who enroll in a specified BERMUDA COLLEGE arts program that may enable them to plan their BERMUDA COLLEGE program so they may complete a specified AMERICAN INTERNATIONAL COLLEGE arts and sciences program in two additional years or equivalent.
- 4. To facilitate the exchange of information and to encourage academic coordination and cooperation between BERMUDA COLLEGE and AMERICAN INTERNATIONAL COLLEGE, including curricular reviews, joint academic advising, and consultation between personnel of the two institutions.

#### Stipulation of this Agreement:

- 1. This agreement will apply to BERMUDA COLLEGE transfer students who graduate from the arts program designated on the attachment to this agreement, having completed a minimum of 20 COURSES, (equivalent to 60 semester hours of transferable credit at AIC) with a minimum grade point average of 2.0, and who enter the arts and sciences program at AMERICAN INTERNATIONAL COLLEGE.
- 2. Transfer students designated above will be accepted into junior/third year status at AMERICAN INTERNATIONAL COLLEGE. These students shall be eligible for the Transfer Academic Scholarship (where appropriate) and housing consideration as all other entering third year students.
- 3. Transfer credit will be granted for additional courses taken by Associate Degree students in which a minimum passing grade was received. These courses (over and above the 60 credits discussed in Stipulation 1) can be counted towards the Bachelor Degree. A maximum of 75 credits can be transferred prior to matriculating at AMERICAN INTERNATIONAL COLLEGE.
- 4. Non-credit or remedial courses adjudged to be below college level would not be accepted for transfer.
