PROGRAMME OVERVIEW

Tourism remains a cornerstone of Bermuda's economy and this two-year programme is designed to prepare students to enter the hospitality industry on a managementtraining track either locally or overseas. It includes both theoretical and practical components. Courses about front-line hospitality processes are combined with those on facilities management and business practices.

A core part of the programme is the work experience that students acquire during the training component in hospitality organisations either in Bermuda or overseas.
